Utah atop stacked leaderboard after opening round of Burns

12 players within 3 shots of individual leaders, Illinois' Buchanan and Missouri's Snyder

KAUA'I, Hawai'i – The No. 16 Utah Utes, winners of two team titles during their fall campaign (Palouse Collegiate and Tindall Invitational), hold a seven-stroke lead at seven-under-par after the first round of the 48th John A. Burns Intercollegiate on Kaua'i. No. 10 Illinois and No. 41 UNLV are tied for second at even par. No. 21 BYU (+1) and New Mexico (+2) round out the top five.

"As the Kona winds stirred up, the Ocean Course played different than the prevailing winds that we are used to," remarked Utah head golf coach, Garrett Clegg, who recently guided the Utes to

the 2022 and 2024 NCAA Championships. “Our boys hit high-quality shots, making pars on difficult holes and birdies when pin placements were more forgiving. Every player on our roster is hungry to compete at the highest level. They strive to prove themselves week in, week out.”



The Ocean Course at Hōkūala is part of Timbers Kaua'i – Ocean Club & Residences, a 450-acre resort surrounded by the Pacific Ocean, Kalapaki Bay and Hā'upu Mountain Range.

Utah finished their opening round with three players in the top seven, led by Sergio Jimenez and Davis Johnson (T3; -3).

Illinois won the Steelwood Collegiate Invitational to conclude their fall. Their momentum carried over to Kaua'i, led by 2024 Big Ten Golfer of the Year and co-individual leader, Jackson Buchanan, who finished at four-under-par. The Fighting Illini senior is ranked No. 14 in America.

Tied with Buchanan is Missouri's Brock Snyder. The sophomore from Iowa and 2023-24 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll member shared, “I was pleased with my four birdie, bogey-free 66. This par-70 provides a exciting challenge.”

Justin Hastings, the San Diego State senior who won the 2025 Latin American Amateur Championship to earn berths into this year's Masters Tournament, U.S. Open and British Open, finished at four-over-par (74).

"Unfortunately, I hit the ball better than I scored," said Hastings. "If I can clean up around the greens, I'll be better positioned for success."

Host Hawai'i was led by sophomore Anson Cabello (T24; +1). The Maui native is no stranger the Garden Isle, having won the 2024 Kaua'i Amateur.

Led by the Ocean Course at Hōkūala's Kellie Hines (PGA Director of Instruction), Hualani Duncan (marketing manager) and Elise Guirao (merchandise manager), all multi-generational natives of Kaua'i, they gracefully led the opening ceremony with a traditional Hawaiian blessing, "E Ala E" to commence the 48th edition of the Burns.

The second round begins at 9:00 a.m. HST. Attendance is free for walking spectators.
